WINTER RETURNS AS SPRING ARRIVES

THE BEAST FROM THE EAST CALLS AT EDRADYNATE.

THE END OF THE SHOOTING SEASON ON 1ST FEBRUARY TRADITIONALLY PROVIDES A COUPLE OF WEEKS FOR SPORTING ESTATES TO “DRAW BREATH” IN ANTICIPATION OF Milder weather and the BEGINNING OF SPRING JOBS.

Very often winter storms reveal diseased and weak trees. Felling and pruning of these is essential for obvious safety reasons, the health of the tree stock and for the cosmetic appearance of the land. This has presented challenges for Ian, Ciaran and Brian but ensured stocks of firewood have been replenished.

This year rural Perthshire was hit hard by the heavy snowfall which brought the UK to a near standstill. Ian and Ciaran have been addressing the issue of the extended “hungry gap” between the end of the season and natural food sources being readily available.

Stone walls and fencing on the estate have undergone repair and rebuild following livestock and weather damage.

Mark Myles (and his trusty pack of hounds) have been instrumental in repairing and reinforcing these boundaries.

This supports the birds while they are most vulnerable coming into the spring laying season.

Fortunately the private water supply has proved reliable and supplies were not interrupted despite the sub-zero temperatures. The livestock, similarly supported through the Arctic weather by the Kennedy families look well with lambing about to start.
